Applications must be submitted by 11:45 p.m. EST on Tuesday, June 30th, 2020. Any grant funds remaining after that date, if any, may be applied for until the grant is exhausted, up until June 30th, 2021.

Students who are ineligible or apply but do not receive a CARES Act grant, but still have financial need, should consider applying for Financial Aid for the 2020-2021 academic year.

*Eligibility

Students who meet all criteria below are eligible to apply:

1. Have a valid 2019-20 FAFSA on file with AAMI Office of Financial Aid or could have been eligible for Title IV federal student aid. (This includes students who filed a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or who are eligible to file a FAFSA).

To meet Title IV General Eligibility Requirements for federal student aid, the student must satisfy the following requirements:

- Citizenship. The student must satisfy citizenship requirements, such as being a U.S. Citizen, U.S. National, U.S. Permanent Resident or Eligible Noncitizen.
 - Social Security Number or Alien Registration Number. The student must have a valid Social Security Number or Alien Registration Number.
 - Selective Service registration. Students who are male, age 18-25, must have registered with the Selective Service System (SSS). If a male student is age 26 or older and did not register with Selective Service, the failure to register must not be knowing and willful.
2. Have a high school diploma or GED certificate.
 3. Maintain Satisfactory Academic Performance.
 4. Working towards the AAMI Associate Degree in Occupational Studies.
 5. Enrolled in Spring 2020 at the time the Act went into effect, March 27, 2020, in at least one on-ground/in-person course, even if that course moved to an online format due to the pandemic.
 6. Students must also attest that they have experienced any of the following disruptions, Food, Housing, Course Materials, Technology, Healthcare, and Childcare.

Not Eligible

1. Per the U.S. Department of Education, International students and undocumented students (including DACA students) are not eligible to receive CARES Act funding.
2. Students who were enrolled exclusively in an online or distance education program on March 13th, 2020 are ineligible for the CARES Act emergency financial aid grants to students.
